Healthy Lunchbox Option Cheese and Bacon Quiche

Here is an easy, healthy lunchbox alternative.

Ingredients:

3 sheets puff pastry (reduced fat)
1 cup diced bacon
1 cup grated cheese
4 eggs
3/4 cup milk
Onion flakes
Salt and pepper



Method:

- 1. Thaw pastry and cut each sheet into 4 equal rounds or squares. Place in greased muffin tray.
- 2. Divide equal amounts of cheese and bacon in bottom of each case.
- 3. Combine eggs, milk, onion flakes, salt and pepper, and whisk to combine. Pour into cases.
- 4. Place in a preheated oven at 180 degrees for approximately 40 minutes.

These can be frozen and taken out in the morning for your child's lunch box.
