This workshop was run at the Mechanics Institute Harden by the Bournda Environmental Education Centre. Year 6 students participated in workshops along with council employees.







Quality Literature in 4/5D



In Term 1, students in 4/5D analysed the text from the song, "I Was Only Nineteen" by John Schumann as an example of quality literature. This emotive song connected us with the difficulties the soldiers suffered in the Vietnam War and, as veterans the traumas they still faced, often experiencing flashbacks when returning to Australia.

In Term 2, the students were involved in a cultural study of Vietnam. Through reading the text, 'Onion Tears' by Dianna Kidd, students developed an awareness of how a refugee child, Nam-Huong was affected by the Vietnam War. She also experienced

flashbacks. Both texts prompted the students to think about how experiences can have very different perspectives and a lasting impact on lives.

Our studies this term will culminate in celebrating through а 'Vietnamese Day' Wednesdav on where students will involved be in food. making constructing а traditional hat. playing Vietnamese sport, learning basic words and learning more about Vietnam through a website and the story The Wishing Cupboard.
