Costing of care is as follows:

- Before School Care \$12, available from 7.00am - 9.00am (When at MPS, for now it is 8.00am start at Bunyip)
- After School Care \$20 (School pick up, then until 5.50pm)
- Vacation Care \$40 per day (8.00am— 5.50pm)

Please note that parents are still eligible to receive their percentage from Centrelink and the 50% rebate still applies.
