# Term 2 Week 10 Building Success

It is well known that students with strong literacy and numeracy skills are more likely to remain at school longer, complete their HSC and continue on to tertiary education. Improving literacy and numeracy standards is a clear priority set out in our school plan, and it was reassuring to hear that our priorities align with the premier's priorities for education in NSW, which is to increase the proportion of students in the top two NAPLAN bands by 8% by 2020.

Just how to achieve this was a focus of discussion during a conference I attended in Albury last week. It is always great to hear what other schools are doing and knowing that we have already put in place innovative practices such as employing a Growth Coach to build the capacity of teachers to use literacy & numeracy PLAN continuums and data: school-wide programs such as Independent Daily Reading and Public Speaking; and implementing programs such as TEN and TOWN. With your support we have achieved close to 100% attendance at three -way interviews where students are able to discuss their own learning goals.

These initiatives focus on teachers having the tools they need to deliver quality learning: students being actively involved in the learning; and parents and carers knowing how they can support their children's learning. When we work together, our students reach their full potential and I am confident this will be reflected in a shift into higher bands in NAPLAN.

And on a much lighter note, I would like to thank every family for their support during semester one, which can only be described as an amazingly successful one. I sincerely hope you have a wonderful winter break. Please remember that Tuesday 19 July is the first day back for students next term.
