All students will benefit from having access to this technology during class assembly items, visiting presentations, and events like presentation night. Early next term, all students will be invited to a movie night at the school, where we will together celebrate this wonderful achievement.

The P&C has also funded eight new school blazers (see photo) to ensure our students look their best for formal occasions such as public speaking, welcoming guests to the school and presentation nights. We now have a total of sixteen blazers in various sizes.

During the holidays, rubber softfall will also be fitted under the fixed play equipment to replace the bark. The total cost of this project is \$30,000, which in part is being met by grants, with school funds also contributing.


