Year 6 Camp

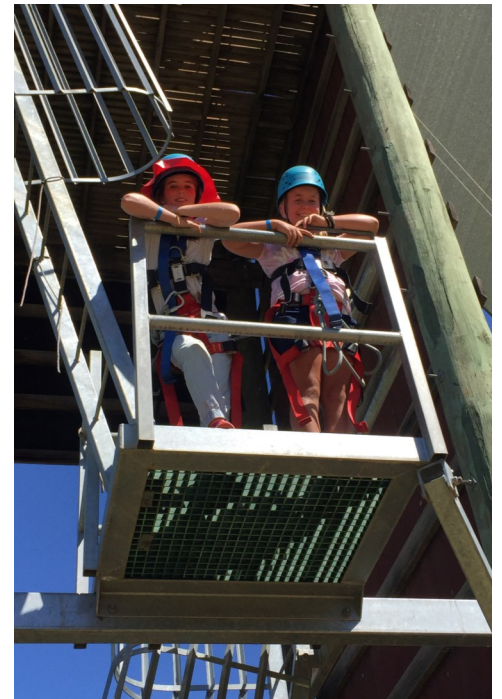
Last Monday Year 6 went to Borambola for three days.
