The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) NAPLAN is a series of tests focused on basic skills that are administered annually to Australian students. These standardised tests assess students' reading, writing, language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. Each year students in Years 3,5,7 and 9 sit this test and the information obtained from NAPLAN helps schools understand the learning needs of students.
