Early Warning Signs


If I feel frightened or unsafe ay sweat a lot, get a sick tum become shaky and my heart might beat really fast.

personal safety. Parents and carers play a vital role in this process as first educators of children in their care. Here at school we provide age appropriate information around body ownership and a right to be safe. This allows for these messages to become part of the child's everyday language and helps to build self-esteem and resilience.

A positive partnership between school and home is important to reinforce key personal safety messages in a clear, consistent manner to eliminate confusion for children. When Ditto's Keep Safe Adventure visits our school on Tuesday parents are most welcome to attend. We would also like to encourage you to ask your children about the show and what they have learnt. 
