Student will be very excited to bring home their reports this Friday. They will be keen to share their achievements with you. Every child has worked hard to achieve their learning goals and everyone's report will reflect their individual differences.

For parents who are used to the A-E grading system from when they were at school, they often see a C grading as being quite low. This isn't the case. **Students who are awarded a C grade are on track and performing at expected levels.** Teachers use the NSW Department of Education, literacy and numeracy continuums to make this determination.

This is a very loose rule of thumb, but generally to get a B grading, the student is performing at one year level above stage/grade expectations. To receive an A the student is performing at two year levels above stage/grade expectations. As you can imagine, an A grading is very difficult to achieve.

A = an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content beyond stage/grade expectations that can readily be apply to new situations. Opportunities for extension are made available.

B= a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content, above stage/age expectations that can be applied in most situations.

C= a sound knowledge and understanding of content and has achieved stage/age expectations in the processes and skills.

D= a basic knowledge and understanding of the content

below stage/age expectations and adjustments are made to the learning program.

E= an elementary knowledge and understanding in few areas of the content well below stage/age expectations and has an Individual Learning Plan developed in consultation with parents.

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data

All schools are required to participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School students with disability (NCCD). We will be entering data on students who are receiving adjustments to meet their additional learning and support needs. This information will be helpful in determining teacher and funding support for our students. 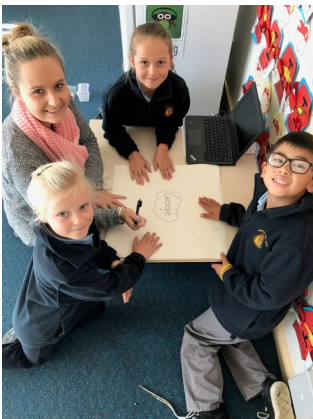
What is happening in Year 2

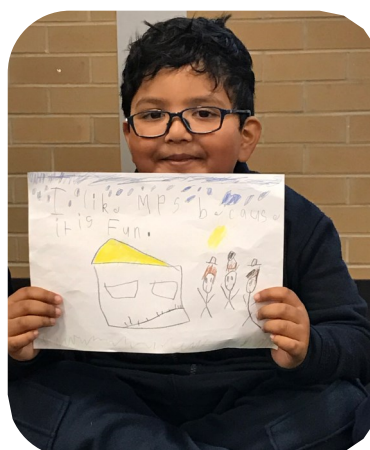
