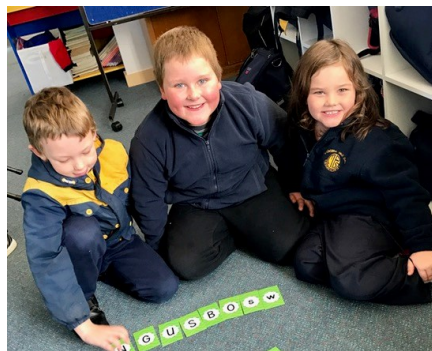


A day in the life of Year 1...
