Our bright sparks loved Science Week! Thanks to our guest speakers, Marg Campbell, Sam Carling and Mr Tim Priest and students from MHS.

















### A day in the life of KS...

The students in Kindergarten have been focusing on a Dreamtime story of Dunbi the owl. They have been using this text to learn about nouns, verbs and adjectives, and the students have used this knowledge to identify these types of words within the text. Because of this in-depth look at this story the students have developed a great understanding of the characters, the structure of the story and how the separate components work together to create a story. The students have each produced a written description of Dunbi and illustrations to outline the events that happened at the beginning, the middle and the end of the story. One of the tasks that the students enjoyed was creating a puppet show to retell the story. The students worked in groups to create the characters and significant parts of the story using paper and pop-sticks. During Mathematics the students have been learning about addition and subtraction and the fact that they are opposite operations. The symbols play a huge role in the written representation of their work and it is great to see the students focusing on writing the numerals correctly. The students are given many opportunities to work in different groups and time to talk about what they are learning. The students benefit from the conversations they have with their peers and enjoy learning from each other.
