### **NAPLAN**

NAPLAN is an annual assessment for all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. It tests the types of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life. The tests cover skills in reading, writing, spelling, grammar and punctuation, and numeracy. The assessments are undertaken every year in the second full week in May.

Last year our school participated in an on-line trial and we expressed an interest in the participating in the roll-out of NAPLAN online this year. The department of education have planned a staggered rollout and limited the number of schools to 400. Murrumburrah was not drawn in the ballot therefore we will be completing a paper and pencil NAPLN this year.

Whilst the NAPLAN tests provide us with very valuable data and information to improve learning programs, it is only one form of assessment used at Murrumburrah Public School. We are certainly not placing an over emphasis on this one assessment, but rather using the data to inform the teaching and learning programs.

#### **NEW SCHOOL PLAN 2018-2020**

During the last six months we have been working hard to develop our new School Plan. The School Plan includes the next three years with a clear focus on learning, teaching and leadership. At this stage we have almost completed the draft plan and look forward to sharing this with the school community. We would encourage your continued feedback and input into the plan and hope to have it finalised in the coming weeks. Draft copies of the plan will be available from the office upon request.
