Our morning sessions consist of an hour of reading activities and an hour of writing. During the first hour we read with either Miss Skinner or Mrs Dunstan and participate in a range of learning stations - fine motor and creative activities, Study Ladder on the computers, handwriting and word work/ comprehension activities based on a story we have read as a class.

In the second hour, we have been creating recounts about our weekends, favourite holidays and embarrassing moments. Our hard work is paying off, as we have seen a huge improvement in our writing in the last 7 weeks!

After lunch, Year 1 and Year 2 form small groups for ten minutes of TEN games (Targeting Early Numeracy). We then go back to our own classroom for our maths rotations. We are thoroughly enjoying the Prime Maths programme and its systematic approach to mathematics. We have received some *FANTASTIC* assessment results over the last two weeks which have allowed all of us to feel success in our learning.

Each afternoon we cover other Key Learning Areas such as History, Physical Development and Health, Science and Technology, Physical Education and Sport.


