Children develop and learn at different rates and in different ways. For this reason we have a range of supports at MPS to meet student learning needs. Mrs Dunstan and Mrs Saunders are specialist teachers who provide individual or small group sessions for children who require highly personalised learning for reading, writing and number work. Mrs Taylor runs the Boost Program which provides sensory breaks, friendship groups and curriculum support. We are very lucky to have Mr Shean, Mr McKinley, Mr Wade and Mrs Foster, our school learning support officers, (SLSO) who assist students in the classroom and the playground. Mrs Sweaney and Mrs Dianne Watt are our visiting school counsellors who are available to provide learning assessments and counselling support to students and their families.

Murrumburrah Public School's Learning Support Team meets every second Wednesday morning to assess student needs, monitor student progress, allocate resources and provide feedback to teachers. Recently the school conducted its annual funding review meeting where parents, teachers and regional staff formally reviewed funding arrangements for students with a diagnosed disability.
