As part of our NAIDOC celebrations, local elder Mr Roy Levett visited our school last week to talk to students about local aboriginal culture and history. Students were curious and enjoyed the artefacts that he brought to share with the students.



What's happening in Year 3

In literacy for the past 5 weeks, we have been focusing on information reports, as well as refining our narratives. We have been looking at how language and descriptions within our texts can create atmosphere and mood to the reader and what we can do to our writing to make it more interesting. Information reports not only allowed us to discover new facts about different animals, we also used our artistic skills to create mirror imaged drawings. Using half a photo of the animal, we had to sketch the other half of the photo image, we then created different effects using pencils and acrylics to produce some very interesting portraits. We hope you got to view them in the foyer.

We are very fortunate to have Year 5 visit us in our literacy groups. Here we are benefiting from the peer tutoring of older students.

In maths we have been very engaged in TOWN (Taking Off With Numeracy), the hands on experience and manipulative to extend our brains, motivates and prepares us to continue on in to PRIME maths.

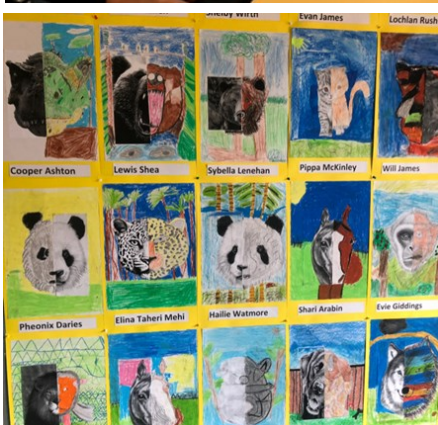
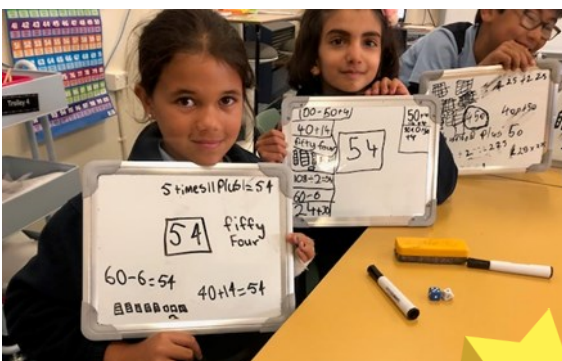
In Science this term we have been looking at the movement of the Sun, Moon and Earth. The students waited for a bright sunny day to measure the length and direction of a stick shadow. The students have also re-enacted the movement of the Earth rotating, the moon rotating the Earth and the Earth orbiting the Sun.

In PDH we are currently exploring Nutrition as part as our Daily Choices unit. What a fascinating and interesting topic this has been. Each week we look at the nutrition labels of the food we eat and measure out how much sugar is contained within 100 grams. Who knew some of our favourite foods that are advertised as healthy and good for you would contain so much sugar!

We were very lucky to have Roy Levett visit our school last week to extend our understanding of our History topic 'What life was like for the Aboriginals before European settlement?' Roy shared with us some very interesting information about the Wiradjuri Group in our local area and we learnt about some very interesting tools that Roy uses to paint with. These included hair, bark and sticks. We were very engaged and excited to be able to view some of his paintings.

After such a full on term we definitely are looking forward to the school holidays!
