A special congratulations to our Kindergarten students who participated in their first ever Spelling Bee and to our Year 1 students who did a fantastic job up 'on stage' during their heat.


Word lists featured many tricky and challenging words for our contestants and it was pleasing to see so many students having the confidence to 'give it a go'.


PSSA Soccer Report

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN 3G

Year 3 have recently started our focus text for the term 'Bugalugs Bum Thief'. Using this text, we focus on a different strategy as we read through, so far, we have really pulled apart who the main characters are and the complication that is rising as we read. We are thoroughly entertained and love the way the author has entertained us with his words and themes portrayed within the book. In writing we are working very hard on creating 'Haiku' poems, using nature as our theme, each student has constructed a poem.

TOWN continues this term and we are really focussed on multiplicative thinking and division strategies. Children have been working in pairs to show their thinking as well as share their thinking with the class. Its amazing to hear different ideas and strategies used to solve their problems.

Geography has really sparked the inquiry in our minds and we have loved exploring Google maps and finding interesting facts about the different climates in Australia. We have been fascinated by exploring where we live and what our land looks like from above without even leaving the classroom.

Last week we took the time to reflect on the previous semesters goals. Students were very honest with themselves and were able to assess themselves as to whether or not they have achieved what they set out to do. We then focussed on what we still need to improve on or a new aim for this semester. This really sets our focus for literacy, maths and personal goals and striving to achieve them.

In PDHPE we are analysing the road environment and how to keep safe when crossing the roads, ride a bike or skate. We have designed posters to show how to stay safe in different environments. Soccer is also part of our unit and we are thoroughly enjoying learning new skills to enhance our soccer playing.
