
A Reason to Celebrate


















Puppet Show

This week, students K-5 will be treated to a Puppet Show performed by Camp Quality.

The touring puppet show for primary schools answers difficult questions kids have about cancer. Often the effects of cancer can be confronting for young kids - when children return to school they often look very different as a result of the side effects from their treatment. This needs to be explained so kids know what the child has been through and why it's important to support them. Importantly the puppets teach students that cancer is not contagious. The show encourages kids to be supportive of their classmate who has a mum, dad, brother or sister impacted by cancer — or who has cancer

themselves, and reduces the likelihood of bullying, exclusion, confusion or anxiety.
