Last week, all students from Kindergarten to Year 5 participated in the Swim and Survive program with our final session being held today. The weather had its ups and downs but we persevered through it, with all students embracing the chilly water and coming away with some incredible new skills. The Swim and Survive program is run throughout schools and it enables students the chance to learn the basic skills of water safety. The younger students focus on water awareness and building upon skills such as submerging, floating on their front and back, and treading water, along with varying survival sequences. Once students have ticked off all the elements, they then begin learning how to keep themselves, and others, safe around the water. As mentioned in the previous permission notes, the assessment portion of these lessons are conducted without goggles, as it helps students become aware of how they would react in a real life situation where they may not have goggles on. It was wonderful to see students being brave and taking risks to learn many new and valuable skills, along with having lots of fun in the water. All students should be proud of how they conducted themselves and displayed our school values both at the pool and during the bus rides throughout the week.

Our swimming for sport program begins this Friday where every student from Kindergarten to Year 6 will travel to the pool. Just a reminder that students will not be picked up from the pool, but will be returning to school via bus. *Miss Georgie Campbell—Swimming Co-ordinator*
