

Building healthy minds, engaged classrooms and equipping our students with skills they need to thrive in life is the focus of the Smiling Minds program.

This well-researched initiative has become an important part of caring for our students and involves daily practice of mindfulness. Mindfulness helps you to focus on the things and people you care about in this moment.

Some of the benefits of a daily mindfulness practice include increased mental wellbeing, greater concentration and focus, increased academic performance, improving relationships and resilience and emotional regulation. Staff are already seeing the benefits in our homes, classrooms and school.

As part of our smiling minds initiative in the school, we are going to be conducting whole school mindfulness sessions at assembly, creating 'mindful spaces' for students within our classrooms and school and bringing mindfulness to all areas of our lives.

There is an app and it is a completely free, state of the art technology platform that supports every member of the school community with hundreds of guided meditations and mindfulness activities that can be used in the classroom and at home. We would like to encourage all our families to have a go at Smiling Minds!

Drop-Off and Pick-Up zones for cars

The staff car park at the front of the school is a very busy place with staff cars and delivery trucks coming and going. We advise that **children are not to walk through the car park** and that parents use the pickup zones in Ward Street and Derby Street.



We have designated departure points for children to use at the end of the school day. Teachers are on duty at the points each afternoon. Eg bus lines, pick-up zone and walkers. Sometimes children do not arrive to where they should be at the end of the day and frantic parents call the school. We can then cross check where we last saw your child. However if they do not consistently use one of these departure points it slows down the process of determining when we last saw your child.

Students have never looked better, even with the cooler mornings students have been arriving to school looking smart in their school jumpers. A greater number of families are also embroidering names on hats and jumpers which is the best way of making sure they come home at the end of the day.
