Students are expected to have at least 95% attendance. When students regularly attend school they are more likely to achieve their learning goals, develop important social skills and friendships and feel connected to our school.

Our student attendance rate has hovered just below state average for quite a few years, however data just released indicates we achieved an overall 93%, which is above the state average for 2019. This is a great outcome for students as we know regular school attendance is linked to school achievement. When students attend regularly they do not miss important opportunities to learn, are able to build friendships and develop their skills through play.

By working together we can have a positive effect on regular school attendance. This team effort includes parents who make every effort to get the children to school, on-time every day; the front office staff who follow up student absences promptly; teachers who are diligent with roll marking; and our school systems that make school a great place to be and celebrate school attendance.
